- *To encourage arrangements that enable Indigenous law students to attain the same graduation and work place participation rates as those attained by other students;
- *To improve the performance of the legal profession in serving the needs of Indigenous clients, law students and lawyers through raising awareness of Indigenous issues in the broader profession and drawing on the skills and resources of the profession as a whole;
- *To advance the legal position of Indigenous Australians.
